

TICK, TICK, TICK...

## Use this handy checklist to help you plan a wedding filled with wonderful, stress-free memories!

## 10 to 12 months before

O Announce your engagement.
O Set a date for the wedding.
O Create a budget based on the style of wedding you want.
O Select a color scheme.
O Choose a qualified wedding coordinator.
O Select attendants, best man and ushers.
O Begin shopping for your gown, headpiece and accessories.
O Have engagement pictures taken.
Select and reserve:

## 6 to 10 months before

O Decide on the number of guests and begin compiling a list with names and addresses.
O Select and order bridesmaids' gowns and groomsmen's attire.
O Coordinate mothers' dresses and fathers' attire.
O Send engagement notices to your local newspapers.
O Select music for ceremony and reception.
O Send your out-of-town guests information packets that include hotel, car rental, local attractions and other visitor information.
O Order your invitations, matchbooks, napkins, programs, etc.
O Reserve rental items for ceremony and reception.

## 4 to 6 months before

O Purchase your wedding rings. Order engraving.
O Arrange a time for and begin planning the wedding rehearsal.
O Finalize honeymoon plans.
O Arrange wedding-night accommodations for the two of you.
O Order your wedding cake.
O Reserve transportation to and from the ceremony and reception.
O Start addressing envelopes.

## 2 to 4 months before

O If you plan on having a wedding shower, discuss dates and themes with maid of honor and best man.
O Make name and address changes on charge cards, driver's license, etc.
O Buy gifts for attendants, parents and fiancé.
O Purchase wedding shoes; begin breaking them in.
O Ask relatives and friends to help at wedding and reception.
O Select ceremony readings and write personal vows.
O Consult with vendors to confirm contracts and be sure communication is clear and requests are understood.
O Select wedding extras: the guest book, ring pillow, favors, and of course, something old, something new, something borrowed, and something blue.

## 6 to 8 weeks before

O Confirm hotel reservations for out-of-town guests and your own wedding night.
O Mail the invitations. Include a map and travel and accommodation information.
O Confirm honeymoon travel plans.
O Set up new bank account.
O Pick up the rings and check the engravings.
O Have the final fittings for your gown and the attendants' dresses.
O Arrange to have the dresses pressed.
O Get your marriage license.

## 3 to 6 weeks before

$\bigcirc$ Plan seating arrangements at the ceremony and reception.
O Speak with the DJ/band about important musical requests.
O Arrange for gown, bouquet and/or cake preservation.
O Have programs printed for the ceremony.
O Write thank-you notes as you receive gifts.

## 2 weeks before

O Prepare payment envelopes for fees and gratuities: clergy, soloist, hotel staff, etc.
O Put someone in charge of transporting gifts at the end of the event.

O Arrange health and life insurance policies or make changes to existing policies to specify new beneficiaries, etc.
O Submit change of address to the post office.
O Give photographer and videographer list of "must-have" shots.

## I week before

O Submit final guest count to the caterer and confirm all details.
O Review details and timetables with all vendors.
Provide them a contact name, arrival time and where to set up.
O Write and mail a note to both sets of parents, thanking them for their love and support.
O Put together your wedding day emergency kit, including aspirin, antacid, bobby pins, safety pins and mints.
O Begin packing for the honeymoon.
O Advise the head usher of any unique seating arrangements.

## I day ahead

O Greet out-of-town guests as they arrive or have someone meet them at the airport.
O Pack things to take to the wedding site.
O Give envelopes with fees and gratuities to assigned person for distribution.
O Give marriage license to maid of honor or best man and remind this person to bring it to the ceremony.
O Rehearse the wedding and attend the rehearsal dinner.
O Give attendants their gifts at the rehearsal dinner.
O Find a quiet moment to exchange wedding gifts with your fiancé.

## Day of the wedding

O Allow plenty of time for dressing, makeup and hair styling.
O Give maid of honor and best man the appropriate wedding band.
O Gather all of your pre-packed belongings and head for the altar. Get there on time.
